Dear Families,

I hope everyone enjoyed the recent long weekend, particularly with the great beach and pool weather we had for the three days! I am grateful that the cooler weather has brought some relief at school this week.

This week is recognised as **Catholic Education Week**. It is a time to celebrate and be grateful for all all the blessings a Catholic education brings. I am particularly grateful for our school community and the many contributions made by many, that make St Mary's School a wonderful place.

Over the past few weeks, many of our students have been able to attend events held off the school premises. These have included; Ash Wednesday Mass, World Day of Prayer, Cricket, Basketball and Volleyball lightning premierships and the Foundation to Year 4 Swimming Program. The feedback from adults in attendance has been extremely positive, complementing our students' overall behaviour, manners and enthusiastic participation. Thank you to **Caitlin Steven**, our Religious Education Leader and our teachers who have prepared these candidates in partnership with their families, the first and best educators of their children in the ways of the Catholic faith. PSYCH CORNER

The Emotional Experience of Stress

Childhood is often perceived as a carefree and joyful time, but the reality is that even the youngest members of our community can experience stress. Stress in children can manifest in various ways. Understanding the emotional experience of stress in children is crucial for parents, educators, and caregivers to provide the necessary support and guidance.

As mentioned in last fortnight's newsletter, the stress response is the system the body uses to energise us to face challenges. When we believe we have the resources needed to meet a challenge, we experience this pleasantly. We call this state *eustress*. Eustress involves emotions such as excitement, motivation, curiosity and confidence. Situations where a child might experience eustress in school include learning a challenging topic of interest to them, sitting a test they have prepared well for, playing a game they've just learned, or talking to a new companion they like.





If we believe we do not have the resources needed to meet a challenge, we experience this unpleasantly. We call this state *distress*. We experience emotions such as fear, irritability, confusion, overwhelm, or despair. School situations that may lead to distress include dealing with conflict with peers, being set a task that they believe is too difficult, or, for some children, being away from caregivers for extended periods.

We can lessen the distress, but not the level of challenge, experienced by children by

- Acknowledging the challenges they are striving to meet 'This reader looks tricky'.
- helping them rethink their resources -'Do you think you might have enough time to do it if you do some now and some tomorrow?'
- providing them with more resources -'What about if we do this bit together?'
- recognising when it is going to take time to develop the resources they need - 'This looks like a big challenge, that we might need to break into smaller chunks and work towards over time'.

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Sacrament of Baptism

Next term, I will be facilitating a **Baptism Preparation Program** for students of families who wish to have their child/ren baptised.
