## News from the Principal

Dear Families,

On Friday 9 June, Sarah Morgante worked with the whole staff to develop an understanding of the new 11 Victorian Child Safe Standards (MO 1359) and together we explored the culture of safety and wellbeing at St Mary's School. We also examined in detail all our staff's responsibility in relation to the PROTECT - Identifying and Responding to All Forms of Abuse in Victorian Schools and our obligations in relation to the Reportable Conduct Scheme. It was a very informative professional learning day and reinforced for all, that our commitment to child safety is paramount.

For those interested in learning more about the Victorian Child Safe Standards, I have included a link to the information here

Last Tuesday, the **School Advisory Council** met. The main discussion was about the new Enterprise Bargaining Agreement (EBA) and the implications this will have at St Mary's School. The EBA has been voted on today and yesterday by all Catholic School employees in the Melbourne Archdiocese, other than Sale, who have their own agreement. My understanding is that it will then be ratified and implemented in the coming weeks. At the meeting, the SAC members supported the continuation of 3/4 and 5/6 camps with the implementation of a student and staff free day for those attending.

The possible 2024 start and end times for the school day and the need to include additional school closure days to acquit time in lieu for staff were also discussed. It was agreed that, if necessary, an earlier finish time could be a suitable arrangement than opening the gates at a later time. At this stage, a decision regarding 2024 start and end times for the school day and the 2024 school closures are yet to be made. Once finalised, arrangements will be communicated with all families.

The other agenda item discussed was 'Strategies for Inclusion and Friendship'. This conversation was about how students navigate times when their friends aren't so friendly in the playground. Through the school's Social and Emotional Learning curriculum and **The Resilience Project**, we are confident that our students will build on their knowledge and skills, eventually giving them age appropriate strategies/behaviours to navigate this social aspect

of their time at school. Over the next two terms, there may be times when your child/ren will bring home their 'The Resilience Project' workbook. Please use this as an opportunity to reinforce the school's values, particularly kindness and inclusion.

Semester 1 student reports will be distributed this afternoon, via email. This written report is one of several elements of St Mary's School's reporting package. I am extremely proud of our students and their achievements. Learning Conversations will take place on the first day of Term 3 and they will be a valuable opportunity to discuss your child's progress, strengths and challenges.

Congratulations to the many students who have represented St Mary's School in many sporting pursuits this term, including; Football, Soccer, Netball, and Cross Country. A magnificent effort was demonstrated by everyone and we are extremely proud of their contribution and the way in which they represented themselves, their family and our school.

Congratulations to Leni, 3/4 Garnet for winning the 'Principal for a Day' raffle. There was an abundance of entries, indicating that our students are consistently demonstrating safe, respectful and responsible behaviour. Leni is a most worthy winner, always displaying role model behaviour. As principal on Friday, Leni has deemed it as a casual clothes day, asking students to come dressed in their favourite colour (with closed toe shoes) and has asked each student to bring a gold coin donation for Clevon, who will represent St Mary's Parish at World Youth Day. We are very much looking forward to Leni being our principal this Friday.

While it has been a relatively short term of nine weeks, everyone has worked extremely hard and the holidays will give everyone the opportunity to enjoy a well earned break from school routines. For those who are enjoying the time close to home, may you take the opportunity to rest and rejuvenate, spending quality time with family and friends. For those who are travelling to a holiday destination, I wish you safe travels and joyful moments to make memories with loved ones.


#### **OUIET ACHIEVER AWARD**


