News from the Deputy Principal

Dear Families,

Annice is currently in South Australia attending a faith formation pilgrimage. The pilgrimage follows the footsteps of Australia's first saint, Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop. We look forward to hearing about Annice's enriching experience upon her return to school, next week.

Today, 57 students from Years 3-6 are competing in the **District Athletics** at Goldsworthy Reserve. From all accounts heard so far, our students are to be commended for their exemplary behaviour as well as for their fair and supportive spirit. The next level, the Divisional Athletics, will be held on Tuesday 5 September for progressing students.

Over the past week we have had many fun-filled activities! We congratulate the Year 4 students on the reception of their **First Eucharist**, commend the Year 5/6 students on their behaviour and participation at **ScienceWorks**, celebrate the talents of families and students in putting together such creative Book Week costumes for our annual **Book Week Parade** and value the contributions of the 2023 Environmental Leaders at their recent **iSea**, **iCare** day. The fun continues this Friday 25 August, when our Foundation classes spend the day at **Werribee Zoo**.

The week's highlight however, was the impromptu Staff versus Students Soccer Match held last Friday afternoon. Apologies to the families who missed out on the initial notice sent via Operoo last Thursday, inviting students to wear their sport uniform. Additional measures are now in place to prevent families from missing school communication. With a 3-3 score and no time for a penalty shoot-out, both teams walked away celebrating their contribution to the memory-making atmosphere the match provided for everyone. Whilst I am relieved that there was not a staff injury form for me to complete, Annice and I felt it necessary to celebrate the recent, amazing achievement of the Australian women's soccer team, the Matildas. The Matildas performance at the World Cup really has inspired the entire nation! We hope that their positive influence encourages all of us to think more deeply about how being proud and content with our best efforts overrides a final score.

Fear and Anxiety



Following St Mary's School's recent online webinar, **Understanding Anxiety and Stress Management in Children**, facilitated by Jesse and Dani (Strength Psychology), here is a suggested read for parents/carers:

Fear and Anxiety—An age by age guide to common fears, the reasons for each and how to manage them, by Karen Young https://www.heysigmund.com/age-by-age-guide-to-fears/

Karen describes in her online article how even the bravest of children can have specific fears at some point during their childhood years. Whilst it can be part of normal growing up and will often dissipate as they grow, it can be challenging to know if it is a developmental part of growing up or something that may need further investigation. As Karen states, *"Fears can certainly cause a lot of distress, not only for the kids and teens who have the fears, but also for the people who care about them."*

She discusses topics such as: loud noises, being separated from you, strangers, the dark, nightmares, something happening to people they care about, being rejected or judged badly by their peers, what others think of them and the fear of missing out.

Karen describes ways that families can support their child with these fears. She offers practical tips around always make sure you say goodbye, meet them where they are, be careful not to overreact, allow them to explore their fear safely, don't give excessive reassurance, teach them the physical signs of fear, watch what they are watching and know that they are watching you too.

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

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iSea iCare

On Friday 18 August, the **iSea iCare Ambassadors** participated in a water focussed day with iSea iCare Ambassadors from other schools in the Geelong region.

To begin the day, we travelled to Balyang Sanctuary and did a study on freshwater invertebrates. We had to collect a sample from the river using nets. Then, we emptied the net into a tub of water and collected the small invertebrates we found in the water. Using the insects we found and an information sheet, we determined what invertebrate species we'd found and if they were tolerant or sensitive to solution. Among the insects, we found fresh water shrimp, worms and beetles.

Due to the weather, we then relocated to Holy Spirit Primary School for the rest of our activities. We conducted tests on a water sample we collected at Balyang Sanctuary for pH, phosphorus and salinity and discussed events that can impact these levels in a water source. To compliment this, we also did a rubbish collection and explored the different types of rubbish found. Next, we looked at different frog species, their sounds and their status, whether they are endangered or not.

To conclude our day, we did an activity based on climate change and emissions where we had to order countries from the one that produces the most emissions per person, to the least. We were shocked to discover that out of China, Indonesia, England, Australia and the United States, Australia has the most emissions per person!

Finally, we did a similar activity with different foods, focussing on the emissions produced during the production of different foods, from meat and dairy to vegetables.
