## Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)



Since 2015 the Victorian Government's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) has assisted eligible families by providing payments to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent as at 29 January 2024, you may be eligible for this funding. In 2024 the amount will increase from \$125 to \$150 for eligible primary school students. The allowance will be paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions/incursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. ## FEE & LEVIES Commitment Agreement

All **NEW FAMILIES** to the school will need to complete a **Fee & Levies Commitment Agreement**, available on the school website:

Parent Portal (password mary175)

CURRENT school families only need to complete a NEW Fee & Levies Agreement if they wish to make a change to their current arrangement with the school. Please contact the school office.

Following presentation to the School Advisory Council of the above 2024 School Fees & Levies, we confirm the following:

There are three compulsory components to school fees and levies billed each year:

- Family Fee: charged annually per family covers the majority of school expenses and includes school paid staff salaries, student protection insurance, administration and operating costs of the school.
- Building Levy: charged annually per family is a building improvements and maintenance levy used for the acquisition, construction and maintenance of school buildings, and to support capital loan repayments. It is compulsory and not tax deductible. (NB: Donations to the School Building Fund would be tax deductible. Please contact the school for more information).
- 3. Additional Charges (per student):

<u>Curriculum Levy & Technology Levy</u> charged annually **per student** to support classroom programs and assist with the cost of textbooks, stationery, classroom materials, educational experiences, IT hardware upgrades, software & licensing.

<u>Chromebook Levy</u> charged annually **per student** in **Years 3-6** to provide a dedicated Chromebook device to each student in these year levels for use in class and to assist with any further remote learning or at home tasks. Devices remain the property of the school at all times.

<u>Sacramental Levy</u> is associated with the Sacramental Program conducted each year for students within **Years 3, 4 & 6** (Reconciliation, First Eucharist/Holy Communion and Confirmation, respectively) and charged annually for **every student** within these year levels. (Please note: although Non-Catholics participate in the Sacramental Program they are not eligible to receive a Sacrament).

Activity & Event Levy charged annually per student to cover a student's involvement in activities where they provide a gift for their chosen recipient for Mother's Day & Father's Day and participate in Feast Days (Mannix, Mercy & McAuley) & Shrove Tuesday (Pancake Day) where support is given to various Community Groups including the St Mary's Parish Pantry. (Please note: The school's Parents & Friends' Association (PFA) will hold various separate events during the year which may include a cost).

<u>Swimming Levy</u> is associated with the compulsory five (5) day Swimming Program for all students in Foundation – Year 4 to support the cost of this program.

Annual Camps (\*Please note: All Camp Food included in the Fee is GST inclusive): Students in Years 3 & 4 will participate in an extended day camp for 2024. Students in Years 5 & 6 will participate in a two (2) night camp (3 days/2 nights).

#### **Family School Fees Statements**

All families are required to have a **Fee & Levies Commitment Agreement** in place.

The preferred payment option by **Direct Debit either annually, quarterly, monthly** or **fortnightly**. Families selecting payment by Direct Debit also complete a **Direct Debit Authority Form**, which will continue to operate for the length of time the family has any child(ren) enrolled in St Mary's Primary School or amounts still owing following departure. Amounts payable are adjusted accordingly each year unless the school receives written advice to the contrary. *Please note: Families who request individual split billing will need to complete separate Fee & Levies Commitment Agreements and their payments will be adjusted accordingly.* 

Alternatively, families preferring to make a one off, **lump sum**, **full payment** at the beginning of the year can do so by cash, cheque, credit card or EFT prior to **28 February**, **2024**.

If families are unable to comply with either of these methods of payment you are asked to make an appointment with the Principal to organise a **Private Fee Agreement,** which will be reviewed each year.

If school fees are not paid, and there is no approved payment arrangement in place, your child(ren)'s enrolment will be reviewed. Legal advice may also be sought for outstanding accounts to be forwarded to a commercial collection agency with any additional collection costs payable (if applicable) payable by the family.

#### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Education Curriculum is GST exempt, and as such GST does not apply to School Fees & Levies. However other activities of a recreational nature (e.g. Food on School Camps) do attract GST and is charged accordingly.

## Medical Management at St Mary's School

St Mary's School requires parents/carers/guardians to contact School Administration if your child requires ongoing medication at school and/or has a health/medical management plan, or has a diagnosed health need. The principal must approve all ongoing and regular administration of medication at school.

If a student at St Mary's School has a diagnosed health care need, complex care need or relevant medical condition, there must be in place:

- A Medical Management Plan prepared and approved by a treating AHPRA Health Practitioner and provided to the school by the parents of the child, outlining the required care and support and an escalation plan to be followed in the event of a related incident, and
- An authorised plan/form, the Medication Authority Form, for administration of medication (if applicable) at school, in accordance with the Medical Management Plan. The school requires that parents make a request to the school when their child requires medication to be taken during school hours.
- A Student Health Support Plan developed between the school and the parents of the child to articulate implementation of required care, support and risk mitigation.

Medical Management Plans may need to be updated annually or when a child's condition changes, a child's medication has changed, before an excursion/camp (risk assessment) or when medication is due for expiry.

#### STUDENT MEDICATION MANAGEMENT

Where students have been diagnosed with a medical condition and require the administration of medication at school, St Mary's School requires parents/carers/guardians/carers to provide relevant information to enable it to carry out its duty of care obligations through a <a href="Medical Management Plan">Medication</a> Authority Form;

**Medical Management Plan**, prepared by the registered AHPRA Health Practitioner and parent/guardian/carer, detailing:

- brief relevant information concerning the medical condition of the student that will be of assistance to the school in its care of the student;
- the type of treatment and the frequency of administering treatment while at school;
- what action to take if the student's health deteriorates; and
- the name, address and telephone numbers for an emergency doctor and emergency family contact.

#### **Medication Authority Form**

 Medication (for non-threatening illnesses) is the parents'/ guardians' responsibility and will only be administered by the school if indicated in the Medical Management Plan and accompanied by a Medication Authority Form completed and signed by the parent/guardian and the AHPRA Health Practitioner. Families must communicate with the school's administration team and classroom educator regarding medication and authorisation forms to ensure the correct actions are taken

A **condition specific Medical Management Plan** - Asthma, Anaphylaxis, Allergic Reaction Plan **do not** require a Medication Authority Form to be completed, unless the form doesn't cover the medication to be administered.

If a student has a presenting health need that requires short term medication (prescription or over the counter) to be administered during school hours, only a Medication Authority Form is required to be signed by an AHPRA registered medical practitioner or pharmacist, and the student's parent/guardian/carer. For any medication that is to be administered during school hours, the Medication Authority Form must indicate the correct required dosage, storage instructions and medication must be supplied in the original packaging with full details indicating the child's name, type of medication, time to be taken and via the correct method, such as inhaled or orally.

Ongoing daily medication is to be provided to the school in a Webster Pack. The school will do its best to administer medicine as required. *Please note:* the school does not allow the first dose of a new medication at school in case of an allergic reaction.

Families are advised that asthma reliever medication ie Ventolin is the only medication that can be kept with the child in a class-room environment. All other medication will be stored in a safe place within the First Aid Room and will not be accessible to young people without adult supervision. Substances prescribed for a particular student e.g. Epipen – are retained solely for the use of that student.

All staff, inclusive of casual relief teachers, are made aware of the students with Medical Management Plans and their Management Plans are displayed in a sensitive manner.


