### **News from the Principal**

I hope everyone enjoyed a lovely day on Sunday, celebrating Father's Day. Thank you to all the dads, carers and male role models for all they do for their families and the St Mary's School community. We hope everyone who attended our Father's Day Breakfast and Liturgy enjoyed the morning and know how valued and appreciated they are. We also hope you enjoyed receiving the Father's Day gifts that were made with love and gratitude.

A couple of weeks ago, along with other Geelong principals and leaders from Catholic schools, I was very fortunate to participate in a Pilgrimage in the footsteps of Mary MacKillop led by the Mary MacKillop Heritage Centre and MACS.

We immersed ourselves in the truly inspirational faith filled life of Mary as we traced her life across Victoria and South Australia ending in Adelaide. The event was organised to promote the development and understanding of the foundations of the Sisters of St Joseph in Australia and offered us the opportunity to develop and sustain our roles as leaders of faith in a Catholic

It was a spiritual journey through the heartland of Portland, Penola and Adelaide, exploring the historic connections of these places with the Sisters of Saint Joseph, Julian Tenison Woods and Mary MacKillop. As pilgrims, we reflected and immersed ourselves in their phenomenal contribution to Catholic schooling in Australia and the many obstacles they faced in order to bring Catholic schooling to the marginalised, especially children in remote areas from poor families. We explored the flourishing Josephite charism in context with our contemporary Catholic educational experience. Fr Julian Tenison Woods, the co-founder of the Josephite Congregation with Mary MacKillop, was a man of faith with concern for the poor and a deep love for the environment. He saw God in everything around him.

This immersion experience was an opportunity to reinvigorate and enhance our own personal growth as leaders in faith, who feel privileged in serving our catholic communities.

Mary MacKillop, Australia's first Saint, faced so many obstacles and adversity in her time and had a profound love, faith and trust in God. She shared these in the many letters she wrote, in her words and in her actions.

Mary MacKillop lived the teaching of Solidarity through her actions for justice. She never judged a person because of their circumstances but strove to change those circumstances. Mary and the Sisters of St Joseph provided friendship, emotional support and a place to live for people who were alone and isolated who had no friends, family or place. She helped people to remain connected to society and empowered them to help themselves and feel they still had self-worth and dignity.

Mary MacKillop spoke and wrote about "Leaning into God", "Leaving it quietly with God" in times of struggle, recognising He is always with you. Mary ensured she spoke with love and was very graceful even when others harmed or excluded

Thank you to Marie and the leadership team for assuming all responsibility for our school and as always, leading so capably while I was away.

As we head towards the end of the term, I thank everyone for their many valuable contributions. When the term break begins at 1:00pm on Friday 15 September, I wish all in our school community a restful break.



### Little Angler Kits for Year 5 students



The Victorian Government is investing \$1.5 million from the Recreational Fishing Licence Trust Fund to provide up to 95,000 Little Angler Kits to primary school aged children in Victoria.

The free kits provide a wonderful school holiday activity for children with their families and help ease the cost of living, providing a fun activity close to home.

Year 5 students at all Victorian schools, including ours, will be offered the opportunity to receive a FREE Little Angler Kit.

Year 5 students have been selected based on the Victorian Curriculum focus, movement and motor development, and safety considerations.

The program is entirely voluntary. Schools were provided with the option to opt out of the program. Our school has opted to stay in the program so that parents can decide whether they want their child(ren) to receive a free fishing kit.

Parents of Year 5 students can advise the school if they do not wish their child(ren) to participate for any reason whatsoever. We support parents in making decisions that align with their family values and beliefs.

The roll out of kits will occur through the second half of 2023 (16 October - 4 December) so that all participating children will have a kit in time for the summer school holidays.

The kits include a rod, reel with line, tackle tray, some tackle and information on how to use them to catch a fish. Please note that the tackle tray includes fishing hooks. The tackle tray will be wrapped in cardboard and placed inside a pocket inside the fishing kit bag, which will be sealed with a cable tie to discourage students from opening their kits until they are with a parent or carer.

Kits will be handed out to students to take home with them as soon as the school receives them. Teachers will tell students not to open the kits until they are safely at home with a parent or carer, however parents can contact the school and request to collect their kit from the school themselves if they prefer.

The Victorian Fisheries Authority will create a Little Angler hub on their website, which will be live when the kits start being distributed. It will have useful information, instructional videos and online resources about where and how to fish linking to existing resources from **Fishcare** and new resources to be produced just for the Little Angler Kits program.

This initiative aims to grow recreational fishing participation in Victoria by actively encouraging primary school aged children to learn how to fish, marine life and the natural environment.




Thank you to the school community for the support provided for our fundraising event at Bunnings Waurn Ponds.


