Dear Families,

Yesterday, we celebrated **Shrove Tuesday**. The morning was filled with the joy of our students eating scrumptious pancakes. Thank you to our wonderful staff members who generously prepared the batter, cooked the pancakes and added delicious toppings to them for our students. They were thoroughly enjoyed and appreciated!

Today is **Ash Wednesday**, the beginning of the Season of Lent. It was lovely that our Year 3-6 students were able to attend Mass at the Basilica. Our Year 1/2 students participated in an Ash Wednesday, non-Eucharistic liturgy at school. Let's use this season of Lent to prepare our hearts for Easter, by praying, putting others before ourselves and sharing what we have with others.

St Mary's School has again been invited to take part in this year's World Day of Prayer that will be held on Friday, 3 March. This significant day is a global movement which brings Christians of many traditions together to observe a common day of prayer each year. Through preparation and participation in the worship service, we can come to know how other countries, languages and cultures understand the Biblical passages in their context. It will also give our students the opportunity to hear concerns and needs others around the world have and pray with and for them. News from the Deputy Principal

Dear Families,

Classroom visits are the highlight of my day! Visits over the past week and a half have focused on norms and routines based on our spelling program - **Spelling Mastery**.

Through explicit instruction, Spelling Mastery interweaves phonemic, morphemic and whole-word approaches to effectively teach the spelling skills students need to become proficient readers and writers. This daily, repeated and cumulative practice helps students master each concept and reinforce and retain key information.

Seeing our Spelling Mastery sessions in action is quite impressive and a credit to everyone involved. The way we remain attentive to the noise level, demonstrate a great deal of learning (and teaching) stamina and safely move through our open spaces are a culmination of our school values on display!

The Year 1/2 students will begin their Spelling Mastery sessions next week.

Late Arrivals/Early Pick Ups

Late arrivals (after 8:58 am) and early departures (before 3:20 pm) are coordinated at the school's administration office. Parents/Guardians are required to use the school's VPASS QR code to sign in or out, via the IPad or mobile phone.

School Assemblies

This year, we are returning to whole School Assemblies.

Four assemblies will be scheduled throughout the term, with a class from each year level cohort responsible for showcasing their learning. Families can access the school's atrium via the Front or Parish Gates, which will open 5 minutes prior to the assembly's start time. The administration area is not used as an access point to the atrium at this time.

Procedure for late pickup of students, after 3:35pm

After school, all school gates are supervised by staff until 3:35 pm. Families are required to contact the school if unexpectedly delayed. Any student remaining after 3:35 pm without any contact received from the family, will be escorted to the Fish Bowl for supervision.

A **late fee** will be incurred of \$1.00 per minute until 4:00 pm and \$5.00 per minute until collection after 4:00 pm.




