## News from the Principal Dear Families.

Term 2 has started very positively. Students are engaged in learning and it has been wonderful to see a shift in the playground, where all students are playing co-operatively and following the schools' play expectations that have been taught explicitly over the past couple of weeks. Unfortunately due to inclement weather last week, we postponed our whole school practice play. We will reschedule this, as it is an important component of our implementation of our play expectations. Special thanks to Marie, Bernie and Nic who have instigated this new initiative and thank you to the teachers and learning support officers for the support they continue to offer.

A reminder that, 'Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education' - Every Day Counts, Victorian State Government. Regular student attendance is vital as it affects a student's school work (academic growth and progress) and social adjustment (attitudes to school). Therefore, at St Mary's School, regular student attendance is expected and encouraged, if your child is not unwell.

School attendance rolls are marked twice daily: 8:58am (morning period) and 1:58pm (afternoon period). Students arriving at school after 8:58am must be signed in by a parent/guardian using the school's VPASS system, located at the front office. In the event where a child is absent for any reason, the school's student absence procedure must be followed. Families are required to send a written correspondence to: absence@smgeelong.catholic.edu.au as well as their child's classroom educator prior to 8:58am, on the day of absence.

Thank you to everyone who came along to celebrate all the mothers and important women in our lives at the breakfast and liturgy this morning. Special thanks to the staff who ensured this special event was possible by their contribution. We wish everyone a lovely day on Sunday and we hope you enjoy the gifts, made with love, by your children.

Our 2024 Foundation enrolment period has now closed. This year we had a large number of current families enrol a sibling. Thank you to the families with siblings for returning all required documents in a timely manner. We had an overwhelming number of applications from new families. Currently we have 36 accepted students, our ideal number, and a waiting list.

Over the past few weeks, members of the leadership team have written the 2022 Annual Report to the School Community. It was pleasing to reflect on a year that while still affected by Covid19, the school remained open for the entire school year and many events and activities were re-established. The MACSSIS data was also very positive, confirming that our school culture, learning programs, and processes are valued and appreciated. Once the report has been verified by MACS, it will be made available via our school's website.

Many of our students have taken part in events in the community recently and it has been lovely to hear members of the public comment on their presence, participation and overall behaviour. Thank you to everyone who supports our students to be their very best both at school and while out in the community.


#### **News from the Deputy Principal**


School wide, our research based practices focus on **mastery of skills** and **knowledge building**. This term's learning is centred around **History** and each year level draws on a range of literature to support our vocabulary instruction and knowledge rich curriculum.

**Window**, by award winning author and illustrator, Jeannie Baker, is supporting Year 1/2 students with learning about changes over time.


To further understand the 'past' and 'present', Year 1/2 students will also spend a day at Werribee Mansion on Monday 22 May.



## Year 3/4—Rememberance & Commemoration

Last Tuesday, Year 3/4 students enjoyed a walk to Johnstone Park to visit the Peace Memorial, complementing their learning about key events in Australian History that are commemorated.

A variety of texts will be drawn upon throughout the term. **Stolen Girl** by Trina Saffioti, supports students to learn about the parts of Indigenous history that are commemorated.



#### Year 5/6—Colonial Australia & Colonisation of Australia

Throughout the term, Year 5/6 students will be learning about Australian colonies, significant people and the changes to the land as a result of the colonisation of Australia. One of their texts, *That Boy, Jack* by Janeen Brian, depicts the realities and challenges of the Colonial Australia period, for the perspective of a twelve year old boy.
